  - c. Sentence mentioning the incident that a connection is made to
  - d. Sentence supporting/building up to thesis statement
  - e. Thesis statement (introduce topic of paper and feeling about the topic)
- II. **Body** (each of these points will create a topic sentence to a paragraph; the "subpoints" listed below the topic sentence will make up the additional sentences in the paragraph)
  - a. Topic Sentence #1
    - i. Supporting detail sentence
    - ii. Supporting detail sentence
